Listed below are the native species expected to bloom in the Botanical Gardens at Asheville during the first half of the month of July. Actual bloom times depend on annual local weather patterns.

Trees and Shrubs:

<i>Ceanothus americanus</i> -.....	New Jersey Tea
<i>Clethra acuminata</i> -	Sweet Pepperbush
<i>Rhododendron maximum</i> -	Rosebay
<i>Rhododendron viscosum</i> -	Swamp Azalea
<i>Rosa palustris</i> -	Swamp Rose
<i>Rubus odoratus</i> -	Large Flowering Raspberry
<i>Stewartia ovata</i> -	Mountain Camellia

Note: Most species listed are native to the Southern Appalachians. Some, however, are alien to this area but are commonly found in ditches, fields, by roadsides, etc.
